

#### INFORMATION THAT STRENGTHENS PRIMARY HEALTH CARE | DECEMBER 2022

The International Institute for Primary Health Care - Ethiopia (IPHC-E) is delighted to share with you the December 2022 online Primary Health Care Resource Center Newsletter for our community. **Primary health care publications** 



The paper: "Barriers and facilitators of maternal health care services use among pastoralist women in Ethiopia: Systems thinking perspective", reviewed by IPHC-E staff, aimed at identifying barriers and facilitators of maternal service use from both community and health care delivery model perspectives. The study aimed to understand the interdependence, interaction and feedbacks of the factors. It recommended using approaches that are responsive to pastoralists' cultural & political ecology as well as health care delivery systems.

A study: "Perceived barriers and enablers influencing health extension workers toward home-based hypertension screening in rural northwest Ethiopia: Interpretive descriptive study", examined barriers & enablers that influence HEWs' homebased hypertension screening in the community. The IPHC-E staff selected appropriate research design and critically reviewed the manuscript. For a successful implementation of hypertension screening, the study recommended training of HEWs and their supervisors, providing protocols and BP measuring equipment, as well as regular supportive supervision.





The article: "Recovery rate of severe acute malnourished children aged 6-59 months enrolled in outpatient therapeutic program at health posts of central Gondar zone, Ethiopia" is a publication supported by IPHC-E small grant research. The findings revealed that recovery, death and default rates of malnourished children were in the acceptable ranges of sphere standards. The study recommended for building the capacity of HEWs to alleviate knowledge gaps on children enrolled to and discharged from outpatient program at health posts.

The article: "Effect of home-based childcare on childhood mortality in rural Maharashtra, India:..." aimed at reducing mortality rates through home-based child care using village health workers. The trial used an integrated approach of home-based newborn care, post-neonatal infectious disease management, antenatal care and behavior change communication & had impact on U5MR, IMR, neonatal mortality rate and perinatal mortality rate in an impoverished area. This community-based childcare model can be replicated for reducing U5MR and IMR in rural areas.

# USAID Transform: Primary Health Care Activity

USAID Transform: Primary Health Care Activity was implemented from 2017 to 2022 and aimed at strengthening Ethiopia's health system. The Activity expanded 111,000 health workers' knowledge & capacity, which improved health service quality. It also strengthened service delivery, data management, & access to medicines & medical supplies. These efforts resulted in a reinforced health system providing quality services in over 11,000 health centers & posts. This report provides progress of interventions in four regional states.

Tracking universal health coverage in the WHO African Region, 2022

The report: "Tracking universal health coverage in the WHO African Region, 2022" has focus on the attainment of UHC in the content. It highlights three crucial lessons on moving forward with the UHC agenda. First is the need to invest in the resilience of health systems. Second, integrated service delivery remains a crucial need in the Region. Last, there are opportunities for countries to learn and share experiences to accelerate progress towards UHC.


#### Guidance

WHO Europe launched "WHO primary health care demonstration platform" that gives a practical understanding of how to overcome implementation barriers and strengthen PHC. The platform experience is structured as four-to-five day visits connecting national and regional policymakers and practitioners from the host and visiting countries. The host country demonstrates well-performing PHC model. The visiting country identifies policies and practices they aim to change and seeks out lessons learnt. WHO European center for PHC tailors program & supports the host country.

**COVID-19: The latest** 





#### **COVID-19** | publication

The study: "COVID-19 vaccine acceptance level in Ethiopia: A systematic review and meta-analysis" offers an assessment of vaccine acceptance in the country. The analysis provided that the prevalence of COVID-19 vaccine was 57.8%. The level of vaccine acceptance was at a lower rate than necessary to achieve herd immunity. The highest level of vaccine acceptance rate was reported via online or telephone surveys. The lowest vaccine acceptance patterns were reported in Addis Ababa.

#### **COVID-19 | UHC Publication**

The report: "Africa's response to the COVID-19 pandemic: A summary of country reports (Jan 2020 to Dec 2021)" assessed the preparedness and response of 47 countries in the WHO African region against the SRP guide. The report summarized the overall response of the countries to the pandemic across the different pillars. It highlighted best practices and/or innovations and discussed lessons learnt from the COVID-19 response. Further, the report provided recommendations for strengthening health emergency response.





#### COVID-19 | Pointer

"Long covid - an update for primary care" updates a previous BMJ Practice Pointer published in August 2020. The authors outline how clinicians might respond to the questions that patients ask. What clinicians need to know is: long-covid (prolonged symptoms following covid-19 infection) is common; the mainstay of management is supportive, holistic care, symptom control, and detection of treatable complications; and many patients can be supported effectively in primary care by a GP with a special interest.

#### **COVID-19 | Policy brief**

WHO policy brief: COVID-19 infodemic management outlines the actions advised to Member States based on recommendations published in WHO COVID-19 technical guidance. The brief also articulates the need for sustained financing and a trained and protected workforce to maintain these life-saving actions in the context of health & non-health emergencies. Further, the document recognizes the need to strengthen the longer-term response for COVID-19 in relation to other pressing public health issues.
